This code is used to classify the population into Rural or into Urban size groups at the county, province and Canada level. In this context all components, rural or urban, of a Metropolitan area or of a major urban area are coded to the R-U size which applies to the M.A. or major U.A. as a whole and always have an Urban code (numeric).
